Our attainment figures are above the national average and almost all are above EDC averages.

#### **School Improvement Priorities 2023/24**

Our Pupil Equity Fund (PEF) is £50, 225 next session. This will be spent on an additional SLA (Mr Flaherty) to support health and wellbeing and will partially fund Mrs Chapman in the Rainbow Room. Following self-evaluation, we have agreed that writing and curriculum design should continue to be on the improvement plan next session. We will also continue focus on health and wellbeing, delivering nurture groups, promoting positive behavior, family engagement and working towards Rights Respecting Silver Award.

#### **Rights Respecting Schools Award**

Well done to Mrs Greer and the Rights Ambassadors who achieved the Bronze Award for our school. We will share the action plan for our Silver Award in the new session.

#### Bikeability-P6 and P7

P6 and P7 have been honing their cycling skills this term, learning in our school grounds and, for competent P7s, on nearby roads. We always encourage children to scoot or bike to school when possible as it's a fun way of keeping fit and it's a low cost way to travel. We ask all children to wear helmets if scooting or biking to school and, once in the school grounds, they should dismount to ensure safety for pedestrians, particularly at the beginning and end of the school day. We anticipate there will be an increase in bike and scooter traffic when the traffic restriction order comes into place in August and we have worked with East Dunbartonshire Council to improve and increase our storage facilities as a result. Please note that all bikes and scooters are stored at owners' own risk. EDC will not be liable for any loss or damage to items on school property.

#### **Traffic Free Schools**

Our school has been selected to be part of the Council's Traffic-Free Schools pilot project. This is where small sections of road immediately outside the entrance to schools are prohibited to motor vehicle traffic for a short period of time at the start and end of the school day.

The aims of the project are to improve road safety for all children and adults accessing the school, while at the same time, making the areas more attractive for journeys to be made by walking, wheeling and cycling.

The Project was recently approved at the Council's Place, Neighbourhood and Corporate Assets Committee to proceed with the pilot. The pilot is due to begin at the start of the 2023 / 2024 school term and will be in place from August 2023. An information leaflet has been sent out to the school

#### **Parent Survey**

We received 86 responses to our parent/carer survey. 62% of respondees had children in P1-3, 38% had children in P4-7.

Overall, the results were positive. Almost all respondees feel that their child enjoys learning at school, their learning is progressing well, their child feels safe and overall they are happy with the school. Most parents feel that the school helps their child to be more confident, their child's learning is progressing well, their child is encouraged and stretched to work to the best of their ability, their child is treated fairly at school, staff really know their child as an individual and support them well and the school is well led.

The majority think the school keeps them well informed about their child's progress, child benefits from school clubs and activities provided outside the classroom, the school asks for my views and school takes my views into account.

The results have been shared with the Parent Council and parental engagement is a feature of next year's school improvement plan.

#### **Important Reminders**

Nut Free School: Please do not send your child to school with any items containing nuts or nut traces. We have children within the school who have severe allergic reactions which could result in anaphylactic shock.

**Medication:** Only certain members of staff are allowed to administer medication to pupils. This can only be done after the parent has visited the school and completed the necessary paperwork. We have strict guidelines which we must follow.

**Parking:** Please do not park on the pavements, block driveways or double park outside the school. Too often there have been near misses at the school gate. Please think of all children and park away from the school at all times. In August, our traffic restriction order will be in place.

**Wet Intervals:** We provide your child with activities to do during wet intervals, if you would like to provide your child with a book or small, inexpensive game, that would be great. Please do not send your child in with any valuable items such as PSP or iPods.

**Anti Vandalism / Health & Safety:** Please report any sightings to the police. As you know we are equipped with CCTV cameras and these are very beneficial to us. Such cameras are fully operational both day and night and allow us to identify and report any vandalism.

**Head Lice:** Please check your child's head on a regular basis and inform the school if you find an infestation.

All Jewellery MUST be removed during Physical Activities (incl PE): I would ask that you refrain from piercing your child's ears until the beginning of the summer holidays as any size of earring prohibits your child from taking part in physical activities. Policy states that staff cannot remove jewellery and plasters cannot cover earrings.

**School Dress Code:** Pupils are encouraged and praised for wearing our school uniform. White shirt and school tie together with the school blazer are always encouraged.

**Mobile phones**: EDC policy states that any child requiring a mobile phone in school should hand their phone into the school office each morning and collect it at the end of the day.

**Tooth brushing**: All children in the nursery, P1 and P2 classes brush their teeth daily in order to create good habits and decrease mouth decay. Pupils brush their teeth within class, after lunchtime.

Failure to do this puts a series of actions in place which could result in calling the Attendance Officer and Police Scotland. If your child is late please explain that he/she must pass the Office to check off their name. The class teacher may have already alerted the Office to begin the attendance check procedures and your child coming to the Office when late could stop this procedure more quickly.
