

## January – February

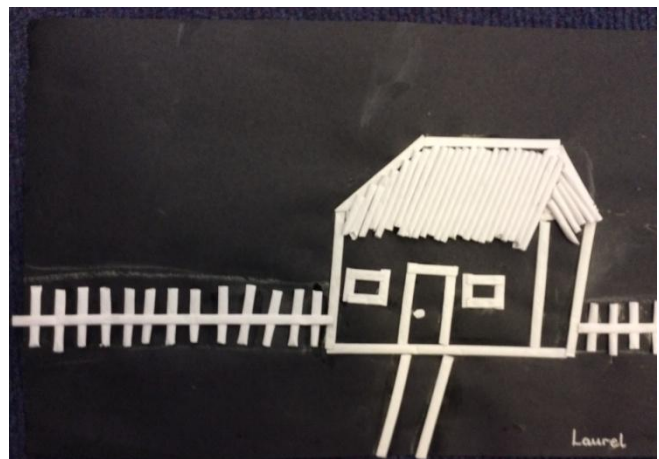
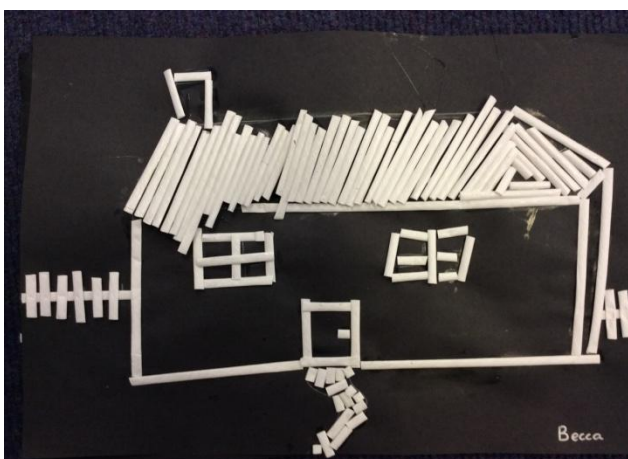
Happy New Year! We have been hard at work since coming back to school in January. Here is just a selection of some of what we have been up to...

We also used art straws to create these lovely pictures of cottages.

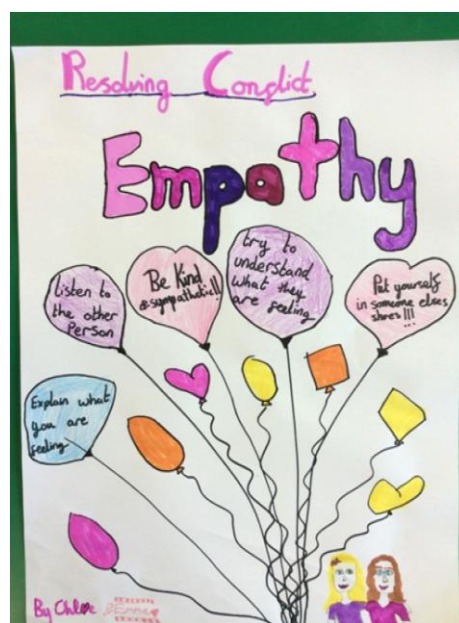


## Information Handling
